


The League of Women Voters of Kentucky built these Draft Maps using 2020 Census data. We're sharing them as seven regional maps to provide bigger images that are easier to study: Central, Eastern, Jefferson and Surrounding Areas, Northern, Southern, Southwestern, and Western.

WHAT IS REDISTRICTING?

After each federal census, redistricting is the process of drawing new boundaries for congressional and state legislative districts.

Using 2020 Census data, Kentucky redistricting will decide on:

- 6 US Congressional seats
- 38 Kentucky Senate seats
- 100 Kentucky House seats
- Many judicial, city, county, and school board seats

WHEN WILL THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY REDISTRICT KENTUCKY'S SEATS IN THE U.S. HOUSE, STATE SENATE AND STATE HOUSE?

At least three scenarios are possible:

- Fall 2021 action during a special session to create districts for 2022 elections
- January 2022 action very early in the regular session to set districts for 2022 elections and move the January 7 filing deadline back a few weeks or months
- February/March/April 2022 action later in the regular session to set districts for 2024 elections

WHY DOES REDISTRICTING MATTER?

Redistricting can make it easier or harder for:

- Voters to learn about candidates
- Citizens to communicate with representatives
- Parties to compete against another
- Members of racial minorities to elect candidates they prefer
- Regions within a state to get distinctive interests considered

WHY DID THE LEAGUE CREATE DRAFT MAPS?

We used 2020 Census data to develop district maps for the US Congress, the Kentucky Senate, and the Kentucky House. We're using them to:

- *Inform* our fellow Kentuckians about how fairer, simpler maps can look
- Advocate fairer, simpler maps that reflect wide public input in discussions with legislators and other citizens
- Gather input at events around the state to use when we develop Recommended Maps to share with the legislature later this fall

WHAT PRINCIPLES WERE FOLLOWED IN MAKING THE DRAFT MAPS?

The Draft Maps were designed to fit three legal rules:

- One person, one vote. Districts must be nearly equal in population. U.S. House districts must be very, very close to perfectly equal. Kentucky Senate and House seats must be within 5% of perfectly equal size.
- Opportunity. Redistricting must provide "districts of opportunity" where minority voters have a chance to select representatives of their choosing.
- County lines. Kentucky Senate and House districts must not divide counties except when needed to create nearly equal districts.

The Draft Maps were also designed with three additional goals in mind:

- Compact districts. We tried to have the parts of a district in easy reach of one another.
- **County seats.** When we divided a county, we tried to create a district that inside that county that included the county seat—and we succeeded <u>most</u> of the time.
- Indifference to incumbents. We designed districts to fit the rules and additional goals, without considering how that might affect current legislators.

WILL THE DRAFT MAPS BE REVISED AGAIN?


Yes. After gathering public input, the League will create Recommended Maps to share with the General Assembly. Those maps will also have more precise lines. THE Draft Maps use districtr.org software to map districts composed of Census <u>block groups</u>. That lets us get close, to exactly equal districts, but not quite close enough. The Recommended Maps will use Maptitude software to assign individual Census <u>blocks</u> to get very close to six exactly equal districts.



FAYETTE COUNTY DETAIL

Six districts are located in Fayette, including three mostly inside New Circle Road. Four others are shared with Woodford to the west, Bourbon and Scott (northeast), Clark (east), and Madison (south).



JESSAMINE COUNTY DETAIL

One district is located in Jessamine County and includes Nicholasville. Another is shared with Mercer and Garrard.




MADISON COUNTY DETAIL

One district is located in Madison and includes Richmond. Four others are shared with Estill, Lee, and Powell to the east, Jackson and Clay (southeast), Rockcastle and Lincoln (southwest) and Fayette (north).



SCOTT COUNTY DETAIL

One district is located in Scott County and includes Georgetown. Another is shared with Bourbon and Fayette.






BOYD COUNTY DETAIL

Boyd is divided into three districts with other one shared with Greenup to the north, one with Carter and Lewis to the east, and one with Lawrence to the south.




PIKE COUNTY DETAIL

One district is entirely in Pike County and includes Pikeville. Others are shared with Floyd and with Johnson and Martin.



HARLAN COUNTY DETAIL

Harlan County is divided into two districts, one shared with Bell to the west and another shared with Letcher and Knott to the east. Harlan was split because Bell County was too small to be its own district and too large to combine with any other whole county.





JEFFERSON AND SURROUNDING AREAS





Sixteen districts are inside Jefferson County. Three others are shared with other counties: one with Oldham, one with Bullitt, and one with Bullitt and Shelby




JEFFERSON COUNTY CLOSER DETAIL

One district is located in Bullitt County. A second is shared with Jefferson and a third with Jefferson and Spencer




SHELBY COUNTY DETAIL

One district is located in Shelby County. A second is shared with Anderson, Mercer, and a part of Franklin


OLDHAM COUNTY DETAIL

Mercer, and a part of Shelby






PULASKI COUNTY DETAIL

One district is located entirely in Laurel County and includes London. Others are shared with Whitley (southwest) and with Knox (southeast).








HARDIN COUNTY DETAIL

Two districts are inside Warren County, including one centered on Bowling Green. Others are is shared with Edmonson, and Monroe Counties






CHRISTIAN COUNTY DETAIL

One district is inside Christian and includes Hopkinsville. Another is shared with Trigg to the east, and a third with Carroll and Crittenden to the west.




DAVIESS COUNTY DETAIL

MCCRACKEN COUNTY DETAIL

McCracken is divided into three districts shared with other counties. One is shared with Ballard, Carlisle, Hickman and Fulton to the west, a second with Graves to the south, and a third with Livingston to the north and east.



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
